


To the Senior Class of 1966, the Advisor, and others who assisted in the production of this worthwhile project: Greetings and congratulations on this signal achievement.


HISTORY

A two-hundred acre campus affords ample space for the college's modern buildings and student body of approximately seven hundred and fifty.






"Advances in technology change our society. Technology changes our environment to which we in turn must adapt. Some parts of the environment "lag" behind others.

Often, much of the source of difficulty can be eliminated by a greater understanding. To reach a mutual understanding it is a prioria that there be effective two way communication. The Student Government Association intends to see effective two way communication this year ... students have physical and psychological wants and desires which must be satisfied to achieve satisfactory adaptation to their environment, and to complete the process of growth and maturation. When these wants are blocked, frustration and anxiety slows down the student's adaptive and maturational process and often leads to aggression ...

We feel that, academically there is a need for a program within the S.G.A. of staff and course evaluation. The past cultural experience has been ineffective . . . It must be recognized that the students have had different backgrounds and experiences which to them seem sufficient."
