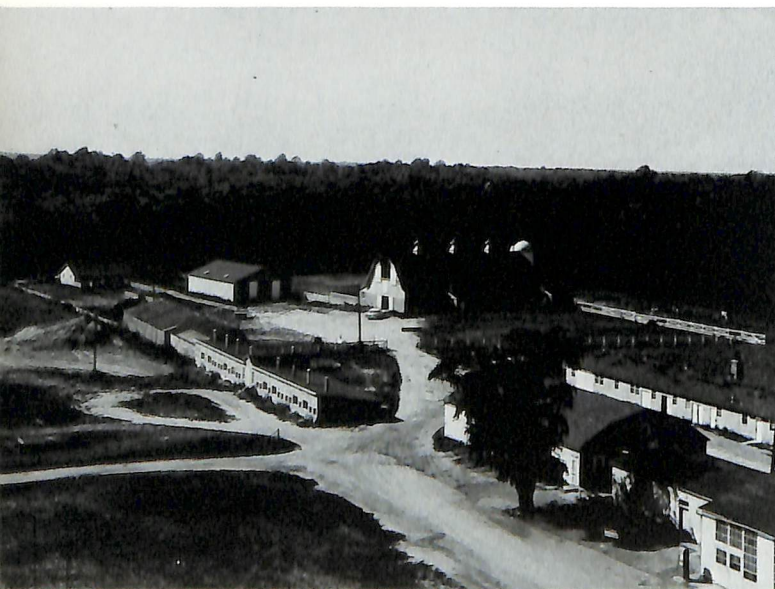
## HISTORY

When these wants are blocked, frustration and anxiety slows down the student's adaptive and maturational process and often leads to aggression . . .

We feel that, academically there is a need for a program within the S.G.A. of staff and course evaluation.

The past cultural experience has been ineffective . . . It must be recognized that the students have had different backgrounds and experiences which to them seem sufficient."

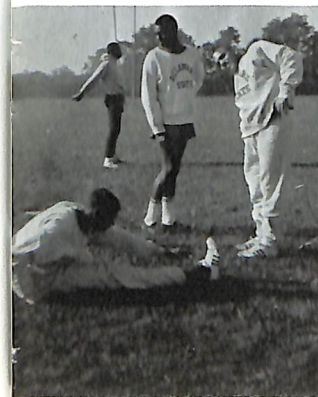


Al Rue was named to the all-CIAA as a back court star, while Ron Horton received honorable mention.

Bennie George, the head coach of the Hornets, was named as CIAA coach of the year. He also ranks second in years of service among the current crop of CIAA coaches.



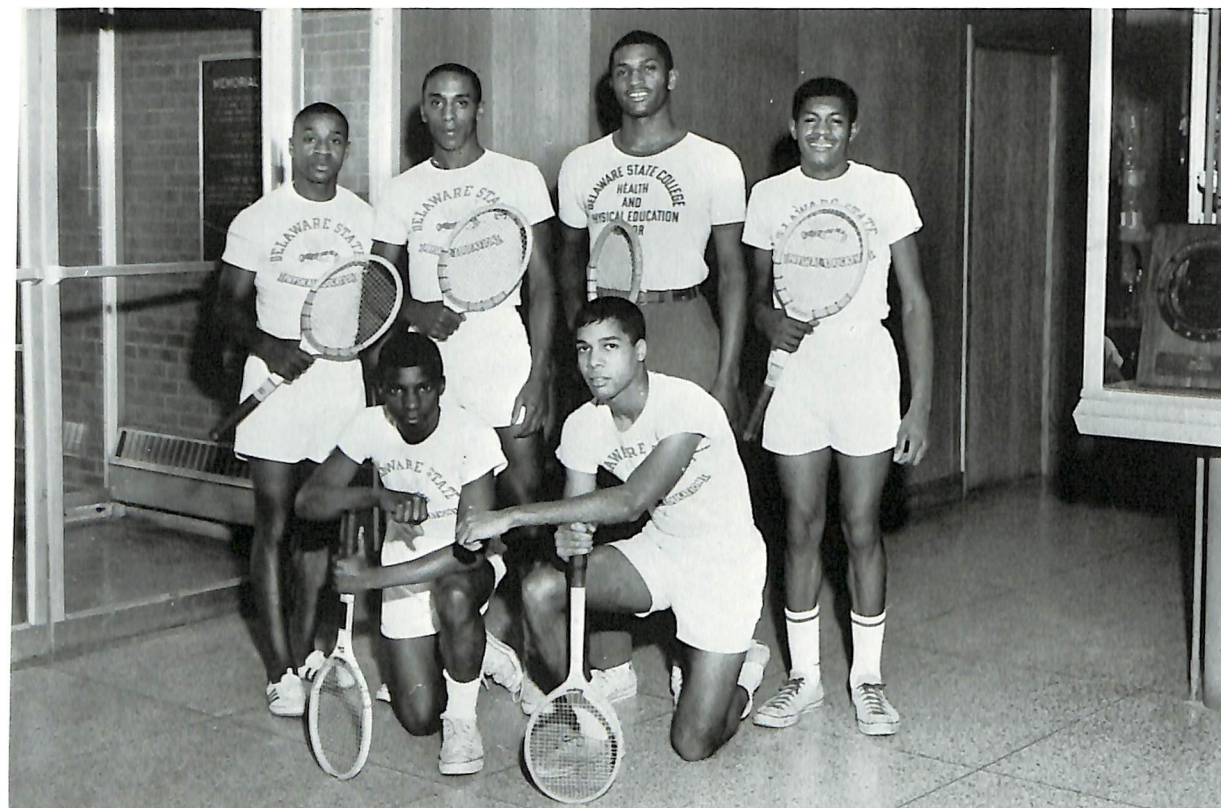

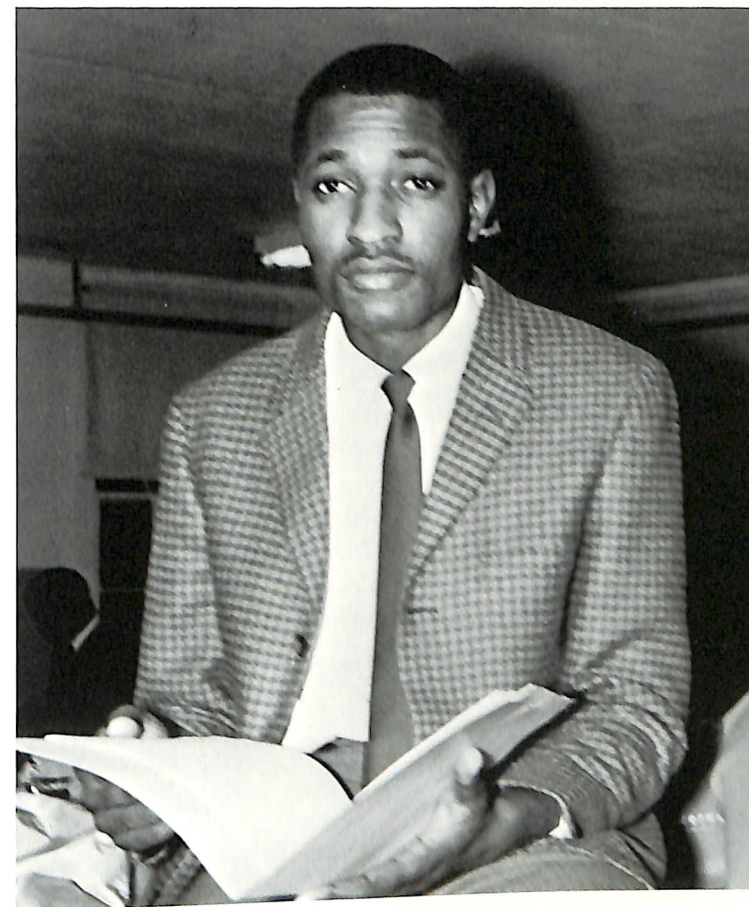
