Medgar Evers was the leader of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People in Mississippi. He was murdered in 1963 in Mississippi. Naming this building after him will show how deeply we appreciate his contribution to society.

Dear Dr. Mishoe:

There seems to be a general lack of concern on the part of the faculty as to the lives and activities of the student body here at State College. Most professors see our students only in one light, that of the daytime student. I challenge the faculty to take part in, and attend as many of the student affairs as they possibly can so that they may see first hand exactly what kind of students they are producing.

In truth, though many of the students may not see it, they are being cheated out of the kind of education they need to survive in our society by the relaxed atmosphere and sub par teaching methods of our faculty. This is not to say that the faculty is sub par- I am saying that the type of student here does not allow a college professor to teach on a college level. I am a student here at the college, and the things I am saying I can see and feel.

It is frightening to think that the people I see here at State are going to be the leaders in the world of tomorrow. Many of them are unable to care for themselves. This is not to say that there are no serious minded students here, for I believe that there are a great many students who feel as I feel, getting a good college education is one of my most important responsibilities, important to my country, important to my people, and important to me as a man.

I ask you Dr. Mishoe to challenge the staff and faculty, and most important, the academic dean, challenge them to produce top flight students, students who can say that they enjoy the benefits of a college education, not some watered down version of an education.

I am very concerned about the role I am going to play in the society of the next generation. I feel that Delaware State College is capable of preparing me to meet the demands of that role. My fondest hope is that the student body of our college realize and accept their responsibility of getting the best possible education, and I also wish to see the educators of our institution demanding the very best from each and every student.

Although the situation did occur, you cannot afford the luxury of being too severe at the cost of such a celebration for any candidate of a Bachelors Degree.

Please realize that graduating from Delaware State College means as much, if not more, to me, as your graduating from Oxford did to you.

I would like to suggest that if Commencement cannot be held on campus, perhaps you could change the location to possibly a large church in Dover such as the Catholic Church. Perhaps you could obtain the services the Hotel duPont has to offer in Wilmington. I don't care where you have it or at what cost, something must be done.

With every wish of success to you in your efforts, I place all my trust in you knowing that you will come up with whatever is appropriate and in the best interest of everyone concerned.
