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Foreword

THIS PUBLICATION lists selected resource materials which, it is hoped, will be of assistance to those seeking information on ways of identifying the potential dropout, on measures which schools and communities are taking in their attempts to solve the problem, and on the nature and extent of the research which is being conducted on the dropout problem. It may also be useful to those who contemplate organizing community action in developing programs of prevention or who wish to explore the financial resources which might be available for this purpose.

The materials contained here have been organized into sections based on the predominant types of inquiries about the dropout problem which the U.S. Office of Education is receiving in large and increasing numbers. Most of the references relate to studies and reports which have been made since 1960. A few, however, date back as far as the early 1950's and have been included because of their historical value or the purposes for which the studies were made.

This publication is a revised version of a similar publication prepared by the Office in 1963 and lists many new items which have appeared in the interim. The materials it contains have been compiled with the help of members of the Office staff who have cooperated in collecting pertinent reports.

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
