- 2. A Photographic Portrait blown up to be unveiled at the program, by Mrs. M.L. King, Jr.

While Dr. Tillman is in Atlanta he is responsible for getting

a. A formal portrait from the King family

b. Conveying messages to the King family concerning the Dedication of the Student Center.

c. Finding out whether Mrs. King will be able to attend the Dedication ceremony. (if Mrs. King is unable to attend the ceremonies, then the substitute would be Dr. King, Sr. or Rev. King (brother).

Dr. Mishoe wanted to know whether a collection of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., should be started now in the Student Center or Library.

It was suggested by Dr. Tillman to ask Miss Winston about getting collections of books by and about Dr. King, Jr. The collection is to be gotten by May 10, 1968, if possible.
