Indeed, the modern agriculture student can boast a curriculum schedule comparable to any other academic department.


Agriculture, man's first and probably foremost contribution toward survival; its future is alive, well and promising at Delaware State College.

The English Department provides a better look into a language that has been termed one of the most difficult.



Although this is one of our smaller departments it is constantly growing and producing some of our more qualified teachers in any area of Home Economics.


